Pillar of Hope (\$1,000 - \$2,499) – you give the gift of **Hope** to someone like Thomas who is 76 years old and his daughter and caregiver Nancy who will receive twelve months of assessment, individualized care, case management services, linkages to other supports and family assistance.



Pillar of Shelter (\$2,500 - \$4,999) – you give the gift of **Shelter** to someone like Theresa and her children, Samantha, Tyler and Nicholas, who will receive counseling, support, legal advocacy and basic medical care for one full month at Constance Morris House as they escape family violence.



Pillar of Support (\$5,000 - \$9,999) – you give the gift of **Support** to people like Paul, Maria and their three children who are facing homelessness by providing three months of support and mentoring through our LATH program



Pillar of Opportunity (\$10,000 - \$24,999) – you give the gift of **Opportunity** by underwriting, six months to one full year, a classroom of pre-schoolers in our Head Start or day care program at the Child and Family Development Center. Your gift will be used to encourage them to think critically, play and socialize actively, explore creatively and learn in a comprehensive and healthy environment.

PILLARS SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Addictions Services offer outpatient treatment for adults and adolescents seeking to overcome drug and alcohol addictions and rebuild their lives. Prevention is also a high priority and includes school-based initiatives, workshops and educational opportunities and community collaboration.

Adult Mental Health Services provides individual psychotherapy; couple, family and group therapy; psychiatric evaluation; and ongoing medication as necessary. Specialized offerings include day treatment, post-hospitalization and programs for the chronically mentally ill and homeless.

Adult Wrap focuses on keeping older adults in their homes and communities, as well as helps families meet the challenges of caring for older adults through caregiver services.

Buddy's Place offers bereavement counseling for children who have experienced the death of a parent or significant caregiver.

Child and Adolescent Services delivers home and community-based services for children and families who require individualized counseling, group therapy, and parenting support.

Child and Family Development Center offers Head Start programs and daycare to support families and help children get a good start in life.

Crisis Intervention Services helps stabilize personal and family emergencies involving depression, suicidal behavior and mental illness; family conflict and domestic abuse; acute alcohol and drug issues; and sudden traumas which affect entire communities.

Domestic Violence – Constance Morris House offers shelter and services, including onsite healthcare and substance abuse counseling, for women and children experiencing domestic violence.

Employment Services offers counseling (individual and group) and job training, with a focus on helping adults with mental illness succeed in competitive employment..

Foxfire Day Treatment provides psycho-social care for adults with serious mental illness. Foxfire has promoted stabilization through the provision of mental health and social rehabilitation services for over 35 years.

LaGrange Area Transitional Housing (LATH) helps stabilize families at risk of homelessness by providing housing assistance and mentorship guidance.

Older Adult Services includes therapy offered at home, various Pillars community centers and in local senior centers; psychiatric evaluation and medication as necessary

Screening, Assessment and Support Services (SASS) delivers home and community-based services to children and families. This program is designed to deflect children from psychiatric hospitalization.

Sexual Assault Services offers evaluation, counseling, advocacy and innovative therapies for people affected by sexual assault - including a 24-hour crisis line and specialized sexual assault programs serving Arab-American women.

Wellness Initiative Network (WIN) and West Cook Housing Initiative(WCHIP) are two coalitions that provide permanent supportive housing and related services to homeless adults living with mental illness to help them stay housed

Pillars aspires to build healthier communities by making connections and changing lives.
